### **PISA Testing**

On Tuesday, members of Year 10 participated in PISA testing which stands for the Programme for International Student Assessment (PISA). PISA is a sample assessment, and as such, approximately 800 Australian secondary schools have been sampled to participate in PISA 2025. The sample selection process is designed in such a way that ensures there is adequate representation of the states and territories, government, Catholic and independent schools, as well as metropolitan, regional and remote schools.

Students fitting the criteria in Year 10 spent around 4 hours completing a computer-based assessment, including answering questions in one or more of the assessment domains (science, reading, mathematics and learning in a digital world), and answering questions about their home background, aspects of students' lives, such as their attitudes and motivation towards learning, availability and use of ICT.


PISA is an age-based sample, and involved all students enrolled in school, born between I May 2009 and 30 April 2010.

# Supporting Your Child's Learning in Year I – Phonics and Numeracy Checks

As part of Queensland's commitment to giving every student the best start to their education, the state has joined the national Better and Fairer Schools Agreement – Full and Fair Funding 2025–2029, announced on 2 July 2025.

One key part of this agreement is the introduction of two important learning checks in our schools:

- A mandatory Year I Phonics Check
- A future numeracy check (currently in development)

These checks are designed to help schools identify students who may need extra support with their reading or maths early on, so they can get the help they need as soon as possible.

These initiatives are all about making sure every student gets the best support for their learning, right from the start.

#### What is the Year I Phonics Check?

The Year I Phonics Check is a short, one-on-one reading activity that helps teachers understand how well students can use phonics to read. It focuses on a child's ability to decode words by sounding out letters and blending them together.



#### How does it work?

- Your child will read up to 40 words aloud to a familiar teacher.
- The list includes both real words and made-up (nonsense) words.
- The check usually takes just a few minutes and is designed to be low-stress.

### Why include made-up words?

Made-up words like "vap" or "jound" are new to all children. They help test decoding skills fairly, as students can't rely on memory or vocabulary.

#### What happens after the check?

Teachers will share how your child went and let you know if any extra support is needed. The results help guide teaching to better support your child's reading development.

### How can I help at home?

You can practise similar real and made-up words with your child in a fun, relaxed setting. Your child's teacher can tell you which letter—sound combinations they've been learning and how to help at home. You can find some great ideas for supporting your child to read through phonics in our **resources to support reading at home**.

In Week 3, 10 Texas students headed to Warwick for the Border Districts Athletics Carnival. Each of them representing our school in different events on the track and in the field.
