Student Resource Scheme (SRS) – 2026

Dear Parents/Guardians,

This letter provides important information about the 2026 Student Resource Scheme (SRS), including how it operates and the annual participation fee.

Purpose of the SRS

The Queensland Government funds teaching, facilities, and administration, but not individual student resources such as textbooks, stationery, or consumables. The SRS provides a cost-effective way for parents to access these resources, ensuring students have what they need to engage with the curriculum while saving time and money. All funds collected are used solely for the operation of the scheme.

Participation

- New students: Complete and return the SRS Participation Agreement Form.
- Continuing students: Participation continues as per the previous year unless a new form is submitted to opt in or out.

Participation is optional but encouraged. Full details are available on the [Department's website](#).

The Student Resource Scheme aims to reduce the cost and administration to families by utilising bulk Departmental pricing with suppliers and ensures each student has the same equipment as and when they need it.

If you are not satisfied the SRS fee represents good value for money based on the inclusions, you may choose to not participate in the SRS. If so, please complete a new Participation Agreement Form indicating you no longer wish to participate.

If you choose not to participate, you will be required to provide all items for your student on the inclusion list and replenish throughout the year as needed.

Resources Included

The SRS includes:

- **Owned items:** Retained by the student (e.g., stationery, diaries).
- **Used items:** Consumed in class (e.g., art or cooking supplies); work produced remains the student's property.
- **Hired items:** Loaned for a set period (e.g., textbooks, instruments, laptops). Must be returned in good condition; repairs/replacements may be charged.

A complete list of included resources and costs is attached and on the school website.

Fees and Allowances

The SRS fee covers resources needed for the year. Eligible allowances may reduce the fee:

- Back to School Boost: \$100 for Prep–Year 6 students.
- Textbook and Resource Allowance (TRA) \$164.00: Reduces SRS costs for Years 7–12.

Financial Hardship & Payment

If experiencing financial hardship, contact the school to discuss options confidentially. Fees can be paid via QParents/BPOINT, EFTPOS, cheque, cash, or Centrepay. Payment plans are available. Unpaid fees are managed according to the Department's [Debt Management Procedure](#).

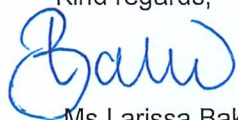

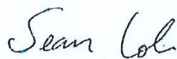
